PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



In recent months I have been relying heavily on the skills and abilities of councillors in connection with many different projects and situations, and I thank them for all their assistance.

One of the most visible things that has been happening in Burston is the installation of the new sewer, with many road closures and a lot of damage being effected to verges and roads. Here I have been helped greatly by Jim Rudd, who is a civil engineer specialising in roads and drainage, and Keith Cowley, who has experience as a Chartered Surveyor. Both of these councillors 'speak the same language' as Anglian Water, and this has been a real advantage in our meetings with

representatives of the company. Anglian Water have promised that when they leave "the village will look better than when we came" - and the Parish Council will ensure that they live up to their promise. I know that at the moment the verges look terrible all round the village, but it is amazing what some top soil and grass seed can do in the spring. A lot has been going on 'behind the scenes'. Alison Wakeham has done an excellent job, as always, in providing the relevant figures to help the council finalise the budget for the next twelve months. The Parish Council has various responsibilities such as keeping the playing field tidy with grass and hedge cutting, maintaining the play equipment, and hedge cutting in various other locations round the village. We have to pay our clerk, pay hire charges when we have meetings, have liability insurance, and maintain churchyards, pay for dog bins to be emptied, and pay for our books to be audited. These items alone account for over two thirds of our £15,000 budget, but Alison has been able to help the council control our other expenses in such a way that our precept will only be going up by £1 a year for a band D house, in spite of many of our costs rising.

Alison has also been of great value as our planning 'lead', and as our representative on the Diss and District Neighbourhood Plan.

We will soon have a Speedwatch team, who will be able to monitor the speeds of vehicles at different locations in the villages, and, in conjunction with Tivetshall, we hope also to have a 50% share of a SAM camera (the sort of speed camera that displays how fast you are going) to try and tackle the problem of vehicles travelling through our villages too fast. Here again Jim Rudd has provided a lot of valuable input.

Christine Stevens is a key member of the council, not only being responsible for footpaths and rights of way, chasing landowners to keep footpaths open and in a walkable condition, but also now producing The Planet through all stages, from collecting and editing the copy, to doing the layout and adding the illustrations, to producing the magazine in a ready to print format.

We continue to be grateful to ForFarmers for actually printing The Planet, and the team of deliverers who put the magazines in your letterboxes.

Tom Grieve and Lindsey Bilston are also valued members of the team. Tom organises the Don Swanton Award each year, and masterminds all the events that we organise, and also provides a younger persons' point of view in Council meetings. Lindsey is responsible for safeguarding, and liaison with the school, additionally providing knowledgeable input whenever wildlife is relevant to a point under discussion. Lindsey is also now our tree warden.

I am glad that I have the support of councillors who are always willing to 'roll up their sleeves' and get a job done.


