PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

We are approaching a busy time for the Council, it's the end of a four year term in May and elections will be held if there are more than seven candidates for the seven parish council seats. If you are interested in becoming a Councillor please contact Ann Baker, the Clerk, who will be able to give information, guidance and any necessary forms to be completed. Forms to be delivered by hand to S N Council by 3rd April 2019.

During the past four years there have been some major achievements. Installation of new play equipment, the removal of 'the shed', the creation of the memorial garden, the memorial stone, registering of the playing field and Church Green with the Land Registry, obtaining a share of a SAM speed indicating camera, the establishment of a 'speedwatch' team, the organisation of litter-picks, and campaigning to keep the Shimpling BOAT closed to traffic, just to mention a few.

Council has also been busy doing all those jobs, never noticed until they are NOT done, such as maintaining the playing field, liaising with landowners about footpaths, budgeting and balancing the books, dealing with planning applications, liaising with 'Highways' about road repairs, maintaining Shimpling churchyard, and contributing to the maintenance of Burston churchyard, supporting the local youth groups of the church and the chapel, cutting hedges and mowing odd pieces of grass around our villages, maintaining benches and picnic tables, installing dog bins and having them emptied, and publishing our full colour quarterly newsletter again to mention just a few.

Thank you to all councillors, past and present, who have contributed to the team effort of the past four years.

Council will have to make some difficult decisions in the coming months and to help us you will find with this issue of 'The Planet' a questionnaire. It will help us greatly if you can complete the questionnaire and have it ready for collection in the next ten days or so. The questions are wide ranging and Council will welcome any comments that you wish to put in the final box. Your answers will help to shape policy in a number of areas as we move forward. IT'S ALL HAPPENING AT BURSTON CROWN

I wanted to take this opportunity to give you a little bit of information about me and about the ambitions the staff and



PLAYING FIELD UPDATE

Maintenance and upkeep of the playing field area is limited through the winter but we are pleased however to report that the repairs to the climbing wall and one of the swings have been completed and these are now back in action. The annual inspection report identified that areas under and around some of the play equipment need levelling off or topping up with soil and grass and we plan to carry this out once the weather improves. None of the equipment is unsafe or unusable so parents can rest assured that it remains safe to use. Following recent requests the dog waste bin in the children's play area has been moved to a more suitable location by the car park entrance where it can be seen by dog walkers passing the playing field as well as those on it — so please use it.

The drainage works installed last summer to the BMX track appear to be working, hopefully enabling the track to be used most of the year. We have agreed a grass cutting contract with a local resident to keep the grass in the community orchard and memorial stone/flower bed regularly cut to allow better access to this whole area. Regrettably rubbish is being dumped in this area (child's broken trike, bicycle tyres, bin bags) and the Parish Council has to pay for its removal as with all fly tipping on the playing field. This eats into our limited financial resources so please if you see anybody leaving rubbish around, other than in the bins provided, remind them to take it home or let a parish councillor know.

On a much brighter note we have been advised that our application for grant funding from the Geoffrey Watling Charity for the play area fencing has been successful with an award of £1500. Also we won top slot with Tesco's Bags of Help charity and received £4,000 so thanks to all who voted. We now await a decision from the Norfolk Playing Fields Association and should then be in a good position to start planning the work – so watch this space.

BURSTON HOUSE HOSPITAL NEWS

Hello to everyone reading. We hope you all had a good Christmas and a positive start to 2019.

Over the past three months we have had festive celebrations, Recovery College courses and planning for Red Nose Day. To celebrate Christmas, we held a Christmas cake decorating competition, karaoke and film afternoons. The cake decorating competition was judged by our Hospital Social Worker, who found it very hard to choose. She liked something about each cake, but eventually managed to make a decision. There were some disappointed people, but that's the risk of entering a competition.

You may or may not have heard of "Recovery College". It was initially set up for people suffering with Mental Health issues. The idea being for those affected to plan a course of their choice, with the help of professionals, and deliver it to their peers. It is very good for their self-esteem and gives them something to focus on, as well as a chance to develop a range of skills. We have our very own Recovery College, here at Burston House. Patients attend monthly working party meetings, which is their opportunity to review the courses that have been offered and share new ideas. As you would probably expect, Cooking from Scratch is a firm favourite. This is a six-week course, following a different recipe each week. It is graded from a fish finger sandwich, up to Chicken Fajitas.

Now it's on to Red Nose Day. This year it is on Friday 15th March and they have said the UK can "do things big and small, that will add up to something massive". So, we will be doing something small. Patients have already started generating ideas. The next step is to have a meeting between patients and staff and get some firm plans in place. It's less than a month away, so we need to get our skates on! Have you made any plans? We will be sure to update you in the next edition of Parish Planet, when we will be heading into Summer. SHIMPLING BOAT (BACK LANE)

Back Lane, Shimpling was on the original route of the main road through the village, but the road was re-routed in the late 1800's. Back Lane became a grassy track through pleasant woodland. Some years ago Back Lane was designated a Byway Open to All Traffic (BOAT), but it was many years later that 4x4 owners 'discovered' the track, and it was widely used for 'fun in the mud'. The track was closed by bollards to enable the signs of damage done by the 4x4s to recover. Norfolk County Council are now taking steps to place a Road Traffic Order in place so that the track can legally remain closed to motorised vehicles, following a successful 'crowdfunding' exercise that has raised almost £5,000 to pay the associated legal fees. It may be necessary to file letters in support of the continuing closure, and if you wish to help in this regard, or just want to be kept 'in the picture' as to what is happening, please contact nigel.pc@btinternet.com.

ST GEORGE'S CHURCH SHIMPLING
