PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In the past three months there has been a lot going on in the Parish Council, but not much to show for it in the outside world! Piers Bilston resigned from the Council and was thanked for his service, and Keith Cowley has been co-opted as a new member so that we maintain our full strength of seven councillors. We are fortunate in this as many nearby parishes are under strength.

We have been exploring all sorts of possibilities. I mentioned last time the drainage of the BMX track and that project is proceeding and we have been taking steps to institute a 'speedwatch' in the village and the installation of illuminating speed signs to tackle the problem of speeding that is frequently brought to our attention. We have been liaising with Anglian Water, with mixed degrees of success, regarding the sewerage works and the road closures. (If you have particular problems with the sewerage works please let me know...) The play equipment has had its annual safety inspection (in addition to the checks that are carried out each week by the village caretaker). We are taking steps to bring the Parish Emergency Preparedness Plan up to date with a new co-ordinator. Behind the scenes a lot has been happening!

Clare Cowan has resigned as Tree Warden and we thank her for her work.

ANGLIAN WATER UPDATE

We are over halfway through our £4.5million investment scheme to provide a mains

sewerage system, which will help to reduce environmental problems in Burston. We have laid 4.5km of new sewer pipes and have 3.5km left to install. We are also making good progress with the construction of a Pumping Station at Audley End where we have built a 9m deep wet well in the ground. We are on track to complete this scheme by April 2018.

We know that this work can be disruptive and we are very sorry for this. We are working closely with local residents, businesses, Highways and elected officials to minimise disruption wherever possible.

We will be suspending our works between 22 December 2017 and 02 January 2018, for Christmas. The road closure and diversion will officially remain in place, however we will ensure that access is fully open to the village during this period.

We will continue to update you as we progress and invite you to visit our website anglianwater.co.uk/yourarea where you can sign up to receive alerts about any work taking place in your area.

B4RN ULTRA HIGH-SPEED BROADBAND INITIATIVE

The B4RN ultra high-speed broadband project is an initiative to bring ultra-high speed fibre optic broadband service to rural areas. It is run by the community, for the community, with future profits promised to go back into the community and with a stated aim to provide broadband speeds of 1000Mbps by bringing a fibre optic cable into your house. There is a proposed £150 connection fee plus £30 per month.

Why did the B4RN initiative come about? Well if you use the internet on a regular basis for your children's school work or you run a business or work from home, or you need to do online shopping then you will require an internet service that is readily available, reliable, speedy and affordable - something the current broadband service struggles to achieve. In future such things as making doctors, dentists and hospital appointments and dealing with banks and utility companies will increasingly be done online, something the existing services will struggle to accommodate. B4RN aims to remedy this by introducing ultra high-speed broadband services. Go to www.b4rn.org.uk for more details.

At a recent meeting held in Gissing, a B4RN spokesperson reported that a distribution or breakout point is planned at Billingford on the A143, tapping into the main fibre optic network linking Great Yarmouth and London. B4RN then plan to connect villages in the immediate vicinity who have enough households interested in their service. Currently Thelveton and Tivetshall St Mary are about to have their networks planned, designed and costed. Ideally Burston and Shimpling would need to be in this group to benefit from this planned expansion. A threshold of 50% of households in the community need to express an interest to initiate the first stage of having a dedicated network designed and costed. A number of households in our parish have already signed up to the initiative and anybody wishing to join them can go to https://b4rn.org.uk/b4rn-service/register-an-interest to express their interest.



The Parish Council supports the concept of better broadband services to the villages either by upgrading the existing network or by new service providers. BURSTON HOUSE HOSPITAL

In our last article we mentioned that we were in the process of developing a bird watching course and practical skills course. Well, I am pleased to say that the practical skills course is currently being run with a patient leading the weekly session. They will practice different skills along the way and know how to plan, prepare and construct a specific item. Our bird watching course has come to an end. It lasted for six weeks, during which time patients learned about ten common British garden birds, such as the blackbird, robin, blue tit and house martin, before going out to spot them. There were good comments all round.

In August we had our traditional summer barbecue as planned; burgers, hotdogs and ice creams galore. Thankfully the weather was on our side, it was a bright and warm day. You may have even been able to smell the aroma of our cooking. We held our annual awards ceremony on the 18th August. We recognised the achievements of sixteen patients, between them they received twenty three certificates. Afterwards, we had a small selection of sandwiches, cakes and drinks to celebrate.

In September, we held an application form workshop and interview workshop for those patients that had applied for the kitchen cleaner Real Work Opportunity at Burston House. We then went on to offer four interviews, from which two patients were offered the two vacant positions. They were very happy.

A few weeks ago there were spooky goings on at the hospital, which funnily coincided with Halloween. We had scary faces carved in to pumpkins, disastrous ghost meringues (partly because we were given hard boiled eggs by mistake), quiztacular questions and even Dracula. Patients and staff particularly enjoyed the quiz, with one team really getting in to the spirit of Halloween and naming themselves "Boney M". The results were very close, the top three teams received 46, 44 and 43 points respectively.
