PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

We are fortunate to have so many volunteers in our Parish. Of course, all of the Parish Councillors are unpaid volunteers, and they work hard for the benefit of residents. The team that installed the B4RN gigabit broadband also includes many local volunteers, who have given up their time, often working out of doors in all sorts of weather, to bring state of the art broadband to our rural community. Friends of Burston Church, a charity that raises funds for the maintenance of the building of St Mary's church, are all volunteers, as are The Friends of Burston School. There are others who volunteer: our footpaths warden, our tree warden, people who deliver this publication -The Planet, and the church magazine - Cock Crow plus numerous people who do small jobs around the village like raising and lowering the flag on the Burston flag pole on appointed days, baking cakes for litterpick sessions and other village 'happenings', cutting some grass that no-one else will tend to, picking up roadside litter on litter-pick days (and on other days as well), helping with village working parties to plant trees and clear ditches.....and this list could go on and on. This volunteering is the oil that helps keep village life moving smoothly.

We should all be grateful that so many people give up some of their time to help the community. However, a few more volunteers are needed. I know that Sybil, who has for the last decade done an excellent job of running the Thursday Luncheon Club, which provides a lunch for senior citizens once a month, is looking for someone to take over that responsibility, and also volunteers will be needed to help organise and run our Parish celebrations of the Platinum Jubilee. RECREATION GROUND REPORT

The start of another year and a new look for the newly named recreation ground. The all-weather footpath seems to be a welcome facility as every time I visit there are people walking along with their dogs, children or just on their own maybe contemplating what it will be like in a few years time once all the recently planted trees start to shoot up. We have one last activity to carry out to complete the scheme that we started last summer and that is creating the wildflower meadow area. Initially we plan to seed the two raised areas with a selection of local seeds gathered last year from around the Parish together with some bought in seeds that will hopefully flower this year. We shall then be commencing the cultivation of the grassed area to the west of the raised bunds so that over the next few years this develops into the wildflower meadow we have planned. We hope to involve the school in the seeding activity in a few weeks so keep a look out for dates and times as all are welcome to come to help. Path walkers will notice that we now have three new information boards describing the new layout and where you are in relation to the new facilities. There is also a new plaque mounted on a timber post denoting that the newly planted woodland has been dedicated as part of the Queens Green Canopy in celebration of this year's Jubilee event.

Ditches around the recreation ground have been cleared to help drain rainwater away. We thank the Thelveton Estate for dealing with the ditch running alongside the trackway to the AW treatment plant. In order to help with access from Gissing Road we shall be forming some steps onto the timber bridge over the ditch.

We are still waiting for the replacement parts to arrive for the Twingo Seesaw in the children's play area and we hope to have that working again soon.

Finally, I would like to mention that we are considering installing an outdoor covered area, close to the play area, that can be used by both the community and the school as an outdoor classroom/event space. This would be an open sided timber structure, hopefully with timber benches and I would very



much like to hear the views from residents on this proposal, both for and against, as we shall be looking to access grants to fund this project. Please email me on keith@burstonandshimpling.org.uk or call on 01379 742766 with your thoughts.

Lets hope for a good year ahead now COVID restrictions are easing and look forward to seeing more and more residents in the recreation ground throughout the year.

As part of the **Million Trees for Norfolk scheme** that Norfolk County Council are promoting we have been fortunate to have been allocated 300 tree saplings to plant in public areas around the Parish. These include fruit trees, native hedgerow shrubs and larger trees, and they have been planted in both Shimpling (the church path) and Burston (the village green and Audley End towards The Carr). Many thanks go to all the volunteers who came out at weekends to help with the planting and also to the Thelveton Estate for allowing planting on their land. The various locations around the parish where this planting has taken place will be shown on the Parish Councils website.

PLATINUM JUBILEE 2022

BURSTON PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have had a busy few months. Our Ofsted visit on 31st November and 1st December 2021 resulted in a GOOD grading, the first for our school since 2006. We are very proud of all the hard work from Sapientia Education Trust, our staff, children, and parents who have helped us achieve this. After our struggles through the pandemic, the children have decided to help others who have been affected as well. As a result, they set themselves a challenge to collect 200 eggs, alongside Tivetshall Primary School, to donate to local care homes. Our school wide value of happiness in December had the children thinking of how they could spread happiness to others. We have been inundated with eggs from the community and local businesses and hopefully will be able to donate many more than our 200 eggs. In January the children were astounded to see 2 large black eggs in a large nest on our school field. There also seemed to be the remains of an egg which might have hatched. We searched the school site for clues and then wrote reports with our findings to help the investigation.

We are slowly getting through the winter months and here at Burston House we have been focussing on lots of indoor projects to help brighten the environment. Patients continue to greatly enjoy artwork and have recently started working with clay.

We have also been engaging in science sessions. Here are a couple of experiments, one involving shaving foam and food colouring, and the other using sweets to make a rainbow effect.





Practical sessions such as woodwork and furniture restoration continue to be popular. The patients are starting to sell some of the pieces they have restored and have had positive feedback, which they are really proud of.

We have also been keen to help local charities. Patients and staff have been collecting items for the local Foodbank, and patients have been collecting empty crisp packets for recycling to help raise money for a local animal sanctuary. We are also planning fun activities for Sport Relief, which will soon be here.
