- 58. Adjournment of the meeting for Public participation, County and District Councillors reports:

Co. Cllr. B. Duffin: reported that the Flooding Report from the team set up by Lord Dannatt (Norfolk Flood Alliance Strategy) had suggested some answers. However he has suggested that some of the report should be scrutinized - there needs to be support for riparian owners/land/home owners; the building of the Long Stratton By-Pass will benefit from £26 million from the Government, the planning application has been submitted with an aim to begin work mid 2023, and traffic using it before the end of 2024 – it remains a single carriageway meeting single highways at each end;

The Vice-Chair thanked Co. Cllr. B. Duffin for his report and the contribution from CAF funding towards the 'Paths and Woodlands' project;

There was a reminder of the Village Litter Pick on Sat. 9th Oct. 9.30am – 12noon – further details are available from Cllr. A. Belgrove;

The Vice-Chair, Cllr. A. Wakeham thanked all residents for their attendance, adding that the Parish Council would shortly discuss the report received from Norfolk Flood Alliance Strategy if they wished to remain.

A short report on the Public Rights of Way - Anita Hughes, footpath/PROW co-ordinator - there are still three items that NCC have as yet to respond to or action — an email enquiry states that an action has been identified — as yet nothing been done; some of the paths crossing the fields have been ploughed; FP41 — on Thelveton Estate is suffering from tall, long grass — as yet there has been no reply from the Estate; Anita has spoken with the landowners where FP5 and FP 13 have issues; Green Lane — Cllr. Wakeham suggested that as this is also related to the Estate, once the Chair returns she will ask the Chair to introduce Anita to Sir Rupert and Alex Mann;

- 66.1 **Progress report on the Paths & Woodlands project** Cllr. K. Cowley reported that the project was well under way, most of the footpath has been dug out all round the Playing Field, there is agreement on where the bund will be created by Cllr. Cowley and Lindsey Bilston;

Cowley reported that the application will be submitted in the near future for an allocation of tree saplings areas on Thelveton Estate and land near Keith Baxter have been put forward, permission for their consent is being sought; Co. K. Cowley will circulate the quotes and a decision made
